The practice continued till 2020 but discontinued due to pandemic. Again it was continued in 2021.

Moreover, teachers from our institution taught them through a Questionnaire based on Basic mathematical Calculations like basic addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Teacher also taught rural women to form basic hindi words by adding different letters like acha, bura ,apna naam, apne pariwar ke naam etc. This helps rural women to get themselves acquainted with basic hindi words which are used in their day to day life.

This way our institution took an initiative to educate poor and deprived rural women who are deprived of Education.
